Rotary Camp for Handicapped Children Opens on Sunday

The second annual Rotary Handicapped Children's Camp for this area will be conducted at Boy Scout Camp Babcock-Hovey, Ovid, August 18-31st inclusive. This camp is conducted jointly by the 20 Rotary Clubs of the Finger Lakes Area for physically handicapped youngsters who, due to their infirmities, are not able to participate in regular summer camp programs.

One of the Rotary Camp objectives is to help these handicapped children realize that they should and can serve a useful purpose in life by utilizing their various and individual talents. Through handicapped, they can strengthen their strong points so that they can fit into a normal community life. It has been discovered in this type of project that the individuals tend to become more helpful, more outgoing, more social conscious - finding that more people are interested in them as individuals.

Last year, 23 handicapped children were accommodated in the first year camp. This year over 50 applicants have been approved and will be in camp for the two week period. These campers are coming from all over Ontario, Seneca, Wayne and Yates counties. The officers responsible for the Rotary camp program are President J. Robert Maney of Geneva, Vice-President William Sheffield of Palmyra and Caleb C. Scutt of Red Creek. Treasurer Donald Johnson of Canandaigua and Secretary Peter Nave of Marion. Recording Secretary Carl Pederson of Geneva and Legal Advisor James Fitzgerald of Geneva. Co-Chairman of the Camping Committee are W. Neil Marvin of Geneva and John Brown of Clifton Springs. William Sheffield is Chairman of the Selection Committee and Dr. Robert Wood of Clifton Springs heads up the Medical Advisory Group.

In preparation of the opening of Camp on Sunday, each of the Rotary Clubs have been asked to send men to Camp Babcock-Hovey at 1:00 p.m. on Saturday to help get the camp ready. There are a half dozen projects that require manpower and these will be accomplished under the leadership of Neil Marvin.

Baroody to Present Awards at Sampson

Thomas Baroody, president of the Common Council, will present trophy awards to the winners of the New York State Championship Drag Meet at Sampson Air-strip Sunday, Aug. 18, at 8:30. This two day event, sponsored by the Empire State Timing Assn. under the rules and regulations of National Hot Rod Assn., will begin Saturday morning with inspection from 9 to 12 and time trials until 5 p.m.

Sunday's inspection will be from 8 to 10 a.m. only with time trials running until 1 p.m. when eliminations will be run off. The public is invited. Strip manager Paul Jackson of Savannah has invited the Arlon Brothers from Akron, Ohio, to enter their two airplane powered dragsters. Their big one is powered by a V-12 Ranger engine and running on Ohio dragstrips. The other one is called the Green Monster No. 5 and is powered by a 1710 c.u. in. Allison B12 airplane engine developing in the neighborhood of 1300 horse power.

These cars are designed and engineered by the Arlon Brothers themselves. Their Green Monster No. 6 turned 144 m.p.h. at the N. W. Regional Championships at Fulton, N. Y., last year. There is a possibility that they may break the world's 1/4 mile record at Sampson this weekend. The No-Mad's Auto Club of Boston, Massachusetts, one of the finest hot rod clubs in the country, have been invited to enter their Chrysler-powered Dragster. Hot rod clubs have also been invited from New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Vermont and Long Island, N. Y., and Canada. Between 300 and 400 entries are expected. The national records will be set at the National Championship Drag Races at Oklahoma City Labor Day Weekend.
