

# Clyde Jaycee projects ahead

 CLYDE — The Clyde chapter of Jaycees, not yet a year old, has several ambitious projects for the near future, according to Tony Giovannini, president.

Among these undertakings are a search for persons over 65 years old who may be eligible for tax exemptions, the Special Olympics, weekend movies, Little League, the cancer drive, and the spaghetti supper Feb. 22. Supper hours at St. John's Hall are 4 p.m. to 8 p.m. with assistance from Chardeen Caterers.

Supervisor Frank DeRenzo asked the organization if they would help the town in finding senior citizens who may qualify for tax reduction. To be eligible, a resident must have an income not more than \$4,000 annually, own his or her home, and be 65 years of age or older. Alan Rotach is chairman of this activity which will include a door to door survey.

Paul VanBortel is chairman of the Special Olympics event. The swimming

and gymnastics competition will take place at Hobart and the track and field contest at Midlakes. District winners will go to Cortland and the Jaycees will finance the transportation and pay the fees.

The Rev. Gary Shaw is chairman of Operations Venus, a statewide Jaycee project to familiarize young people with venereal disease. A slide presentation will be available and it is planned to have an assembly program.

Clyde Jaycees are planning to have weekend movies in a month or two and Hugh Miner is in charge. The films will be regular full-length productions. In cooperation with the Fire Department, the organization has ordered red decals to be affixed on houses and at the rooms where invalids or young children might need help in case of an emergency.

President Giovannini also announced that Ken Downey and Warren Leisenring are co-chairmen of the upcoming Little League baseball program.

Sue Giovannini, Maureen Jackson and Marcia Bailey, wives of Jaycees, have agreed to serve as co-chairmen of the cancer drive in March. The club has donated \$25 to the American Field Service chapter here. The Jaycees expect to become incorporated soon.
