Alumni Association Treasurer Report

The financial position of the Alumni Association continues to be strong thanks to the support of our members. The Square Foot Fund as of April 1st has increased to \$15,600.80 after a significant donation. The Alumni funds balance is \$2848.74. At last year's annual meeting we approved the rental for a stump grinder and trencher to use at camp this year which still needs to come out of the fund balance. We also have \$11,526.80 in the Camp Site Improvement fund. These are donations that were received last year for projects we were going to address this spring. As soon as restrictions are lowered, we will begin to address these projects. Our Alumni membership continues to grow and currently consists of 80 lifetime and 10 year to year members. Please reach out to all Scouters 21 years or older, who have worked as a summer camp staff member or who have attended Camp Babcock-Hovey as an adult and extend an invitation to join the Alumni. In February we had a successful work weekend where we worked on cleaning up Algonquin Campsite and working on various Campsite Shelters. We also built permanent bunks in the main bunk room of Eagle Lodge. Tshipey Achtu Lodge held their Winter Fellowship weekend at Camp and also helped us out in Algonquin Campsite. In April we got to host the third annual Top Shot Challenge



with resounding success. Thank you to Eric Falkman and his crew for making it happen. In April we also hosted the second annual Scoops' Chess Challenge. FYI

myself "Pawn" and Scoops played a game to see who would host the 2019 tournament. Scoops' won hands down, so look out for this event again in 2020! In April we also had our spring work weekend where many Properties Committee Members and Alumni helped to start building fences along some of the steeper ravines in Camp near the campsites. They were designed with a snake rail design and I think they turned out excellent. In May we hosted the spring induction weekend for Tschipey Achtu Lodge. Besides the normal tent setups around camp a special crew helped us install stairs on the front side of the OA Stage to open it up some more. Neat little fact, the kitchen crew for the OA had their own shirts made up this year.



We completed a lot of project at Raccoon Work Weekend: Pack and Troop 29 helped us clean up the lakefront; Troop 5048 helped fix the canvas flaps on the lean-tos; Troop 3 added electric to many things around camp; Troop 315 helped to clean latrines; Troop 327 helped clean out firepits; Troop 4 helped work on platforms in Oneida Campsite; Troop 43 cleaned up the chapel as always; Troop 44 helped level tents around camp; Troop 94 helped to paint benches. Troop 90 probably painted or clear coated something; and I honestly don't

remember what Troop 300 did but they were there! Before summer camp started Troop 44 helped us finishing setup in Oneida Campsite and Jake Clancey and crew installed a new fence in Skip's campfire area.

Kyle Bunce, Camp Ranger moved on to a new job just prior to start of summer camp so Pete Heiderich provided Ranger services for the summer camp.



In August we welcomed our new camp ranger Freddy Stien into our fold. We hosted an awesome Orienteering Challenge in September followed by even more an awesome Webelosree in October. In the fall we finished the gravel road between Archery and Scoutcraft and added a gravel parking lot to Pedersen Lodge, just prior to the CTC. Can't forget about the CTC where we had over 1,500 people in camp for the weekend. We once again had "Rice Krispy Treats as big as your face". Bill Tilley and many camp staff helped to make the Alumni Trading Post Fundraiser a success. Big Shout out to Doug Reynolds that makes this event possible year after year. In November Matt Crance acquired over 50 picnic tables to share among the three camp properties. His

lovely wife and Jay Laitenberger and Bill Tilley helped get them into camp along with the ranger staff.

As the year winded down we received two large donations into our Campsite improvement fund from Troop 3 and Troop 167. These monies are being used to extend our electric and water service into camp sites along with adding additional new fire rings to all the campsites. Any monies left over will be used for the final 4 shelters to be built in the 4 lean-to sites. It was a very jam-packed year! I know I missed a lot of volunteers that helped at camp this year. Thank you to everyone that helped make Camp great this year. Let's make 2020 even better!


