

Camp Volunteers



It is a difficult task to maintain a camp property consisting of 300 acres, especially in the spring when there is a lot of mowing and clean-up required. The Camp Ranger could not keep the camp looking as good as it does without the help of some dedicated volunteers, especially when he has been overseeing the work on the new pool shower house. We are very lucky have two individuals who have been there to assist him with those everyday tasks that need attention. They are Hank Roenke and Jim Belaskas.

Hank lives in Geneva, NY and is at camp 2 to 3 days a week, weed whacking, cleaning up leaves and debris around camp. He also works on campsite improvements such as the new grills located in each one and keeps the Quartermaster shed in order. He ensures that there are tools available for any unit that would like to do a conservation project around camp. He also maintains the area around the pool. When you see Hank at camp, he usually has a weed whacker in his hands.

Jim lives in Fairport and he is usually at camp two to three days a week. Jim's favorite activity is mowing grass. He also runs a lot of the equipment at camp to complete the more difficult tasks such as the tractor with the backhoe and bucket. If you need a pile of dirt moved, Jim will do it. In addition to the time Jim spends at Babcock-Hovey, he also spends two to three days a week at Camp Cutler doing the same type of work he does at Hovey. When you see Jim at either camp, he is usually mowing grass and there is a lot to mow.



When you see these two Scouters, please thank them for their effort in helping to keep our camps looking pristine.

<u>Alumni Association Treasurer Report</u>

The Alumni Association financial condition continues to be in good standing thanks to your support. The Square Foot Fund has increased to \$16,128.20. This endowment fund will continue to support camp from the interest we receive from it. The Alumni Fund balance now stands at \$4,704.17 with \$400 earmarked for stone to be placed near Onieda. The Executive Committee authorizes money from this fund throughout the year for various projects such as charcoal grills in each camp site, storage cubbies at the new pool shower house for the Scouts to place their belongings when using the pool, repair and maintenance of the push mowers used to mow the grass in smaller areas of camp, and for aeration units in the latrines in most of the campsites. This is an ongoing project. We currently have \$12,599.03 in the Camp Site Improvement fund. Out of this fund \$2000.00 has been allocated for improvements to the lean-to sites. The remaining funds will be used to complete the projects each donor requested. Our Alumni membership has grown to 89 lifetime members and 11 year to year members. YEAH! WE HAVE ATTAINED A TOTAL MEMERSHIP OF 100! Dining Hall Annex Renovations

We are excited to share that we have made extensive progress on the new shower house. While it's not totally complete, it's getting there and will be ready for scouts this summer. Since the last newsletter we've completed the installation of the electrical system and lights. The doors were installed and painted. Additionally, we've installed the plumbing fixtures and much of the water supply lines. We're almost ready to turn the water on and we hope to have it functional soon! The exterior will be painted when it's consistently warm. We're eternally grateful to all the support we've received from our volunteers, many of whom are members of the Alumni Association. We cannot wait to see it completed and ready for a much-needed 2021 summer camping season.


